Extra organics collection event happening April 24 - 28

Are you planning to do some spring cleaning to your yard this month? If so, you may end up with more yard waste than what fits inside your green organics cart. This year, the City is introducing four new extra organics collection events to help residents dispose of extra organics waste and the first one is happening from April 24-28. During this week, on your regular waste collection day, you can put out extra yard/organics waste in a brown paper lawn or yard waste bag for pick up alongside your carts.

The other extra organics collection events will occur May 29-June 2, October 2-6, and October 30-November 3.

Please note that during the rest of the year, only the amount of organics waste that will fit inside the green organics cart with the lid completely closed will be collected and bagged or other organic materials placed outside of the cart will not be collected. During these times, if you have extra organics, you can save the material for the following week's collection, practice grass-cycling to help reduce yard waste, or bring your extra organics waste to the Eco Centre (up to three cubic metres) at no charge.
