Black Knot

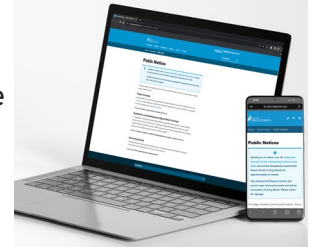
