Alcohol consumption at Jubilee Park

As part of the updated Open Space Area Bylaw, and in conjunction with the Community Standards Bylaw which took effect July 1, 2024, residents of legal drinking age can now consume alcohol in Jubilee Park. Alcohol consumption is allowed only in the designated picnic area at the north end of the park between 11 a.m. and 9 p.m. Learn more at sprucegrove.org/AlcoholInParks.



New speed limits for residential neighbourhoods

Spruce Grove is committed to improving traffic safety and creating safe, sustainable roads and quiet, peaceful neighbourhoods for all residents. To support this, speed limits in residential neighbourhoods will be reduced from 50 km/h to 40 km/h, starting August 31, 2024.

The decision is based on recommendations from the Spruce Grove Roadway Speed Limit Study conducted in 2023 that indicated reducing speed limits would improve traffic, neighbourhood safety, and support calmer, quieter neighbourhoods. Learn more at sprucegrove.org/SafeRoads.
