### **QUESTION:**

Bring forward an additional business case for snow and ice removal, as per discussions at Council retreat, and a plan to update Council's snow and ice policy.

## **RESPONSE:**

Public Works requires a change to the operating budget and also a change on the capital plan for snow removal equipment dependent on the operating budget increase.

These increases are required to maintain service levels with the addition of 9 km of sidewalk or an 11.25% increase in sidewalk/path inventory.

#### **BACKGROUND:**

Public Works currently has 80 km of sidewalk and path inventory for snow removal.

Current service levels require that snow shall be cleared within 48 hours after the end of the snowfall event.

There are currently 5 snow routes on paths/sidewalks for the city.

The current snow policy needs expanding or broadening of the policy to include the clearing of additional public walkways (or sidewalks) that are now maintained by property owners.

# FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS/TAXATION IMPACT:

The operating budget needs an increase of seasonal employee for six months (\$45,000 per year) and another \$35,000 to cover operational costs for fuel, maintenance, consumables and replacement contributions.

The capital plan needs an addition for Sidewalk snow removal equipment for \$100,000.

#### **Description:**

This business case is for the expansion of service through the addition of a six-month seasonal employee to include removal of snow from sidewalks on the side of residential properties.

#### **Business Need:**

This business case is added as an enhancement of service to the residents of the City of Spruce Grove who own properties with walkways on the side of the yard. Many of these properties have large lengths of sidewalks that may be burdensome for those with low levels of ability to clear snow from walks.

The operating budget needs an increase of seasonal employee for six months (\$45k per year) and another \$35k to cover operational costs for fuel, maintenance, consumables and replacement contributions.

#### **Options:**

Increase seasonal staffing and equipment levels to take on 9km of additional sidewalks/pathways into the City inventory. This amounts to an 11.25% increase in this type of inventory.

# Impact if Not Implemented:

Some areas of the City will go without proper sidewalk clearing where the property owner does not complete the required work or possible delays if the property owner does not complete the work within the required timeframe required by the bylaw. Other residents could incur slip and falls or slower transit times on uncleaned walkways.
