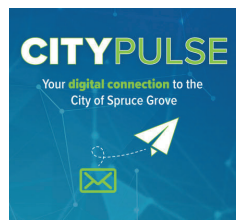

Learn how to recognize Dutch Elm Disease and how to prevent it!

What is Dutch Elm Disease? It's a
deadly disease that affects all species
of elm trees and is caused by a fungus
that is then spread by beetles.
Symptoms include: leaves suddenly
wilting, leaves changing colour and
shriveling but not falling, and
discolouration once the bark is peeled
back.

It's only legal to prune elms in Alberta
between October 1 to March 31.
Pruning outside of this range can
attract elm bark beetles to your
otherwise healthy tree, infecting it.
