Exploring Heritage Grove Park with your pup

Heritage Grove Park is a great way to spend some time outdoors with your four-legged furry friend. When exploring park pathways and open spaces, make sure to keep your dog on a leash, this helps keep humans, other canines, and wildlife safe in the park! Construction waste and building site cleanliness

Did you know? Builders are required to follow the Community Standards Bylaw to help keep construction sites clean and safe within the community. Here are some of the rules they need to follow:

- Keep sites clean by properly storing building materials and equipment, using waste containers, and preventing mud or debris from spreading onto roads.
- Maintain access to private properties, sidewalks and driveways.
- Follow noise restriction rules — construction is permitted from 7 a.m. to 10 p.m. (Monday to Saturday) and 10 a.m. to 10 p.m. (Sundays).

If you have concerns about nearby construction or site cleanliness, learn about the steps you can take at sprucegrove.org/ConstructionSiteCleanliness.

Register to vote

Did you know you can check in advance to make sure you are registered to vote in the municipal election this fall? Find out if you are registered to vote by visiting voterlink.ab.ca and if you're not, you can easily register online until August 15! This information will provide the City of Spruce Grove with a list of eligible voters, but don't worry – if you arrive at a voting station and your name doesn't appear on the permanent electors register, you will also have an opportunity to register to vote at that time. sprucegrove.org/Election.
