

Learn how to spot and safely remove black knot

What is black knot? Black knot is a fungal disease that causes an infected plant to develop greenish brown to black swellings.

The disease affects a wide range of prunus species, including plum, cherry and apricot trees in Alberta. The City regularly inspects trees for black knot on public property. Maintenance of trees on private and residential properties is the responsibility of the property owner.

Learn how to recognize Dutch Elm Disease and how to prevent it!

What is Dutch Elm Disease? It's a deadly disease that affects all species of elm trees and is caused by a fungus that is then spread by beetles. Symptoms include: leaves suddenly wilting, leaves changing colour and shriveling but not falling, and discolouration once the bark is peeled back.

It's only legal to prune elms in Alberta between October 1 to March 31. Pruning outside of this range can attract Elm Bark Beetles to your otherwise healthy tree, infecting it.
